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- **Business Tax Reform** issued recommendations to support development of a measure to simplify business taxes and promote economic growth.

Advancing Racial Equity



- Secured a joint contract for Racial Equity consulting services with Assessor-Recorder and Controller
- Offered robust department-wide trainings, as well as targeted trainings for Managers – each employee received 6 hours of training and managers received an addition 2 hours – totaling 8 hours
- Held monthly department wide employee engagement events to build an increased culture of belonging and inclusion
- Changed Minimum Qualifications for positions to widen the applicant hiring pool

Budget at a Glance

2025 & 2026

- Increase Department Revenue by \$355K
- Delete 10 FTEs of vacant positions, including ones provided mid-year
- Substitute 3 FTEs to a lower cost FTE
- Increased philanthropic support for Kindergarten to College and Financial Justice
- COIT Request for \$1M
- Reviewing possible increase to City Attorney services for litigation
- 20% or \$288K reduction in software licensing budget
- Add ongoing costs for Empty Homes Tax
