II. Reviewing Recommendations and Report Structure

Jacob Dumez highlighted key recommendations that the Advisory Group agreed upon and led a discussion around the recommendations. The following are the recommendations and areas of focus:

- Structural reforms that strengthen and reform safety net and public benefits
- Community planning and design
- Protecting benefits
- Working with city departments
- Funding and fundraising
- Distributing payments

Jacob Dumez overviewed timeline for the draft report. The goal is to circulate among Group members just before or just after Thanksgiving, with the final report to be issued on January 15th, 2022.
